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Grade: 4th-5th	Date: June 1, 2012	Time:
Subject: Science		Topic: Human Environmental Interaction in the Borderland

Set:	Show a map of the border and ask: What kind of impact could the border fence have on wildlife?	
Objectives and Purpose:	Students will watch the Sierra Club's movie and create a poster to show the impact of the border wall on wildlife	
Materials:	paper, pencil, computers, class white boards	
Input:	1. Show the Sierra Club's movie: Wild Versus Wall http://arizona.sierraclub.org/conservation/border/borderfilm.asp (Movie is 19 min. long so you may want to show a portion of it and then discuss.)	
	2. The teacher will show a poster from the Sierra Club to use an example. http://dl.dropbox.com/u/369702/ BorderFullColor.pdf	
Modeling:	Brainstorm with students things they saw in the movie that affected the animals on the border. Write several examples of this cause and effect on the board.	

Check for Understanding:	Do students understand the relationship of the border fence and how it affects animal wildlife?
Guided Practice:	Divide students into five groups. Have each group go to a white board and write their ideas to the question: What kind of impact does the border fence have on wildlife? Then have each group share their ideas.
Independent Practice:	The teacher will show students how to research pictures and create a poster. Students will then create a poster on the computer to show how the border fence impacts wildlife. The poster should include: a creative caption, images, and a paragraph describing how the border fence impacts the natural wildlife. Students will orally share their posters.
Closure:	
Evaluation:	A rubric can be created for this poster including: 1. Creative caption 2. Wildlife images 3. Well written paragraph
