Frank will speak about two of his Latin American projects focused on environmental health. The Arizona project is a partnership with the farmworker advocacy group Campesinos Sin Fronteras and two medical centers in Yuma County: the Yuma Regional Medical Center and the Regional Center for Border Health. The Lake Atitlán project is a partnership with several Guatemalan organizations and includes analysis of contaminants in subsistence foods and the breastmilk of the Mayan communities in the watershed.



Frank A. von Hippel is a professor of environmental health sciences in the Mel & Enid Zuckerman College of Public Health and the lead of UA's One Health Research Initiative. Frank has taught ecology field courses in over twenty countries, and conducted research in the Americas, Africa and Australia. He conducts research at the nexus of ecotoxicology, mechanisms of toxicity, and health disparities, with a focus on Indigenous and underserved communities. Frank is the author of The Chemical Age (University of Chicago Press, 2020; https://frankvonhippel.github.io/pubs.html) and he hosts the Science History Podcast (https://podcasts.apple.com/us/podcast/science-history-podcast/id1325288920).
